For one day tour we would recommend to travel to the heart of the famous wine region of Zichron-Ya'akov on Mt. Carmel.

The western Carmel region is one of the most ancient wine production locations of the ancient world. Since biblical times The name "Carmel" is deviated from the name "Kerem-El", which in translation from Hebrew means "God's Vineyard". In ancient times this place was well known for its rich soils and one of the best places for agriculture, especially for growing olives and grapes:

And I brought you into a fruitful land of Carmel, to eat the fruit thereof, and the best things thereof... (Jeremiah 2:7)

The Carmel area was famous for growing exceptional grapes and producing wines. Ancient wine presses, along with other evidences of ancient viticulture were found here. The wines from the Carmel region were considered to be of premium quality, exceptional in their taste and flavor. The region is often regarded as the Tuscany of Israel.

Tishbi Winery

We will start the day at *Tishbi Winery*, located in the Nadiv valley on the southern slopes of Mt. Carmel, surrounded by vineyards. Founded in 1985, Tishbi Vinery was one of the first boutique vineries in Israel, and was often awarded internationally for its excellent wines. It started as small family vineyard and remains a family affair. The winery has a bakery and a restaurant situated under a vine pergola. Worth seeing is the alembic still for distilling brandy, purchased from the Cognac region of France. The Valrona chocolate tasting room is also a highlight. A tasting of fine chocolates with various wines is an excellent combination, popular for chocoholics.

West of the Tishbi Winery is *Ramat Hanadiv* memorial gardens and Nature park. This natural gem is dedicated to the memory of Baron Edmond de Rothschild who was the benefactor of Jewish settlements in the area since the 1880's and the founder of the first winery. Ramat Hanadiv's vision focuses on the creation of sustainable interactions between man, nature and the environment. While the gardens are exquisitely landscaped, the surrounding nature park offers many trails and archaeological sites including ancient wine presses.

After a short drive up the hill we will arrive at *Zichron Ya'akov*, a charming little town which still has an atmosphere of pre-state Israel. It is situated on the top Mount Carmel, overlooking the Mediterranean Sea. In 1882, settlers from Romania first arrived in "Zamarin" to put up their first tents and then houses. It was then that they took their first tentative steps toward viticulture, the start of a romance with wine that continues to this day.

Carmel Winery

Carmel's Zichron Ya'akov Wine Cellars, built in 1892, is the largest winery in Israel. On the premises, is a modern, state-of-the-art facility making small quantities of quality wines, from Carmel's finest vineyards. The most advanced, modern winemaking technology blends in with the historic 120 year old cellars. Baron Edmond de Rothschild adopted the farming village, changed its name to Zichron Ya'acov, in memory of his father James Jacob (Ya'akov) de Rothschild planted extensive vineyards and founded Carmel, Israel's largest winery. In 1892 he built the Zichron Ya'acov Winery and the famous deep underground cellars.

Our expert guide will lead you around the winery and talk to you about the winemaking process. Test your palate as you sample some of the produce.
